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Pet Beds and Supplies

Dixie Sutton presented information on our new charity this year, Father John's Animal House in Lafayette, NJ. We will be making pet beds at our Saturday workshop on January 13th at St John's UMC in Hope, NJ from 9 am to 3 pm. We have plenty of donated fabric for the pet beds, but if you have scraps of batting or fleece that you can supply, please bring it along. The beds for the cats only need to be 14 x 18, just a little larger than a placemat, so they should be relatively easy to create.

A list of supplies that can be donated instead of, or in addition to the beds, was handed out at the last guild meeting and includes: canned dog and cat foods, non-clumping litter, liquid dish detergent, liquid laundry detergent, bleach, paper towels, tall kitchen garbage bags, Clorox moist wipes (<u>Not</u> Lysol), cat toys (no feathers), and dog toys (hard rubber chew types).

Father John's is a non-profit organization that participated in a network of rescue programs that responded to calls of help to save animals in Texas and Florida during the recent hurricanes. They are also partnered with People for Animals to provide low cost medical procedures for animals in our area. Father John's hosts several annual fundraising events, including Tails and Trails at Camp Nejeda, as well as an annual beefsteak dinner, and they provide senior dogs and cats to loving homes in their Still a Best Friend Program. Please join us on Saturday, January 13th to create beds and blankets for our furry friends in need. Donated items will be collected at the January (by Cindy) and February (by Dixie) meetings.

Meals-on-Wheels Placemats

Approximately 80 holiday placemats were presented to Debbie Fox of the Visiting Homemaker Services to be given out to homebound folks living in the Warren County area who rely on the Meals-on-Wheels program to provide them with at least one hot meal daily. Thank you for making their days a little brighter! Our next collection will be in March for the Easter holiday (which is April 1st this year). Please continue to open your hearts and hands and make some Easter/ spring placemats during these cold winter months. Your efforts will be rewarded by the smiles they bring to others.

Foundation Paper Piecing Hints

Finger pressing tool - A piece of wood from a wooden clothes pin makes a great pressing tool.

Copying a Paper Pieced Pattern with your Sewing Machine - Copy patterns using your sewing machine. Use this method when you want a large number of identical blocks. It works best for simpler blocks that do not contain a large number of tiny pieces: To copy the patterns, staple about 10 pieces of newsprint paper to the master pattern, using a couple of staples each on all four sides of the pattern to prevent shifting. Then use a size 14-16 denim needle and a fairly long stitch length to carefully sew through all the lines of the pattern. I like this method better than printing the patterns because the perforated pattern is visible on both sides of the paper.

Joining two units together for stitching - When joining two paper pieced units, hold them together with vinyl coated paper clips instead of pins. The pieces will line up better than if they are pinned. Remove the paper clips as you sew.
