


Quilt of Valor Blocks



Blairstown Historic Preservation Committee Exhibit



It is slated as the "Heritage Open House" and will include the quilts, artwork, and historic artifacts from family collections of lifelong Blairstown residents. Our guild name has been included in their advertising, so please be vigilant. If you are not participating, please make yourself aware of the basic information in case people inquire about it. Dixie Sutton, Jayne Bodolsky, Rich Danner, and Cindy Smith will be available during the show to demonstrate hand-quilting and answer questions about quilt history and quilting in general. Keepsake Quilting Rebounds with New Owners

Most quilters are familiar with the once-mecca quilt shop of Keepsake Quilting in New Hampshire. We have all looked forward to the latest catalog and the newest and freshest ideas since 1986. Several years ago, the shop was sold to an investment company and has changed hands three times since then with absent owners. The kits were out-sourced and the shop itself reduced it's hours of operation in an attempt to push the business into the digital world. However, the quilting world fought back. Last month, a long-time employee of Keepsake encouraged a family-owned and operated business out of North Carolina to buy the business in Center Harbor and it did! If you've been disappointed with Keepsake recently, give them another chance. The new owners were suppliers to Keepsake and will be creating the kits in-house once again and bringing back the old charm of the favorite American quilt shop. There will be a sale coming up in early June and there are plans to add more employees to accommodate the ever growing quilting population. The shop will once again be open 7 days a week and incorporate quilting novelties and gifts in addition to the 12,000 bolts of fabric! (This is not an endorsement of their products.
