ITSY, BITSY, TEENY, WEENY, YELLOW, POLKA DOT BIKINI CHALLENGE

Rich Danner has challenged us to the *Itsy Bitsy Challenge* this year! Starting now and progressing through June 2023, you must complete (sandwiched, quilted, and bound) a small patchwork quilt (minimum 36" x 36" without borders) that must *feature* polka dot fabric in the quilt top. No block can be larger than 6"x 6" and for every one 6" x 6" block, you have to match it with four 3" x 3" blocks (pieced blocks, *NOT* a plain piece of 3" fabric!!). Rich has offered to run a workshop with some helpful hints for reducing bulk, so if you are interested in this please let Cindy Smith know so she can organize a workshop date and time. Rich is also willing to work with participants with his design service for foundation paper piecing. Please contact Rich Danner with any questions regarding this challenge. Good luck and may the 1/4 be with you!
